PROPERTY – Debbie Procter:

• Actions Completed:

- Inglewood Mechanical changed the filters on the HVAC System on Friday, March 17. This service is part of our service contract with them.
- Received the final invoice on Thursday, March 16 from Provincial Glass & Mirror for weather proofing the Main St. & Queens Ave. outside entrance doors. This stipulation was part of the Green Energy Audit initiative. Total cost was \$3.384.35. RFF was issued to pay this.
- Schindler Elevators (Skyline Elevators) two emergency service calls \$1,208 and \$552. RFF issued to pay this.
- Shawn Smith, Fire Inspector for Lambton Shores set up a fire inspection for our building on Wednesday, March 22. There were some fire equipment issues noted that needed to be addressed.
- As a result of the Lambton Shores fire inspection Georgian Bay Fire & Safety Ltd. was contacted. They came and did our annual fire inspection as well as replaced 5 fire extinguishers that had been noted by the Fire Inspector on his report due to the expiration dates beyond the six-year limit. They also changed one exit sign battery, as it was not working which was also noted on the Lambton Shores Fire Inspectors report.
- After discussion with Janna, the office administrator, it was decided that the plastic wall letter/pamphlet holders in the office hallway needed to be reorganized for better convenience and accessibility for our Community of Faith.
- Our new projector screen quit working and a new circuit board had to be installed. This should be covered under warranty.
- Outside church security lights timer changed over from Standard time to Daylight Savings Time.
- Inside accent lights timer changed over from Standard Time to Daylight Savings Time.

Action Pending:

- Queens Ave. door sill re-cemented.
- Final Green Energy Audit will be completed by Deb Gill and Debbie Procter in the next couple of months. There is a time frame when we can only do this.
- Property management is working with the church Trustees to find a spot in the church, to place a 4-drawer storage filing cabinet, for the church's cemetery board records.
- Training on the new church door locking system will start mid-to late April. There is a monthly charge for Pure Access door locking system.
- Contacted Pro Able to come and repair the Queens Ave. automatic door opener when it quit working. Property Management along with Bob Illman tried to fix it. We were not successful. It is an electrical issue and neither of us are electricians. Awaiting service.
- Lower-level ladies washroom tap not working properly. Jayden's Mechanical was contacted, and it was determined that a new part had to be ordered. Awaiting return service call.
- Painting the yellow caution reminders on the cement curbs around the church's parking lot and Main St. steps needs to be reapplied again. Will ask for assistance to do this.
- Schedule a fire drill at the end of our Council meeting in either May or June.
- A 12 ft. step ladder is needed by the Property Management to do regular repairs around the church.
 A request has been placed in Shorelines to see if we can purchase a good used one from someone for a reasonable price.

PROPERTY – Debbie Procter:

Action Pending (cont'd):

- Church Parking donation boxes will be readied for the May 15 change over to coincide with the Lambton Shores parking meter by-laws.
- The remainder of the outdoor water taps including the Community Living Room sprinkler system and the Rotary Club water refilling station will be turned on before May 15.
- Outside Green Cathedral benches will need to be pressure washed in May.
- Outside windows will need to be cleaned in May.
- Outside Green Cathedral area stage will need to be pressure washed in May.
