CHOSEN by Matthew West

MEDITATION: Remember the last time you tried to be something you're not, just to impress someone? Maybe you put on a smile when you were really having a tough day, or pretended to like something just to fit in. We've all been there—trying to live up to an image that feels more

like a costume than reality.

Romans 12:2 encourages us not to conform to this world's patterns but instead to be transformed by renewing our minds.

Society says, "Be someone they'll like."

But God's pattern says, "Be who I created you to be."
It's easy to get stuck in a cycle of trying to meet
expectations that God never intended for us. We wear
these masks because we think we have to, but they
only hide our true selves.



Sometimes we try to reinvent ourselves, hoping it will change our image. But just like a cheap Halloween mask, it doesn't take long for the façade to crack. Sometimes, our true identity just won't let us hide!

If you've ever felt like you're wearing a mask—whether it's to cover up insecurity, fear, or just to seem "cool"—you're not alone. But here's the good news: God sees right through the mask and loves the person underneath. Think about it. Why do we spend so much time trying to impress people who might not even remember our name tomorrow? Meanwhile, God, who knows everything about us, loves us just as we are.

We can get so caught up trying to look perfect that we miss the beauty of just being ourselves. But what God wants is the real, unfiltered version of us—blinks, goofy faces, and all. Proverbs 23:7 says, "As someone thinks in their heart, that's the person they become." What we believe about ourselves shapes how we act. If we believe we're only lovable when we're perfect, we'll keep putting on those masks. But when we believe God loves us just as we are, masks become unnecessary. We start living as the unique, authentic people God created us to be.

Take a moment and ask yourself: What mask have you been wearing lately? Is it the "I've got it all together" mask? Or maybe the "I'm too busy to need help" mask? Whatever it is, try taking it off and letting God's love fill in the gaps. Be who God made you to be, because identity matters, and you have been chosen.




